Monthly Tidbits

In the Good Oi' Days of June

In 1919 (100 years ago), the average annual income was \$1,125. The average cost of a new house was \$5,626. A loaf of bread was 10¢, and a gallon of milk was 62¢. You could purchase one dozen eggs for 38¢. Stamps were 3¢ each. A car cost \$355, and gas was 25¢ per gallon. According to the Consumer Price Index Calculator, \$1 in 1919 is equivalent to \$14.89 today.

Bírthstone — Pearl

Pearls are finely polished beauties that come in various shapes and sizes. Traditionally, pearls are white or ivory, but they can also be found in pinks, purples, blacks, and golds. The pearl is very different from other birthstones, because it is not really a stone at all. Pearls are created by mollusks, such as clams or oysters. When a grain of sand finds its way inside the mollusk's shell, the mollusk seals off the irritant by coating it with nacre, or mother of pearl. After many coatings, it becomes rounded, and a pearl is born.

Flower — Rose

The rose, the flower for the month of June, represents



beauty and perfection. Its name comes from the Latin word rose, which means "red." It's one of the earliest flowers known to man. In fact, Nebuchadnezzar, the king of Babylonia around 560 BC, used roses to decorate his home. In modern floral tradition, red symbolizes love. White symbolizes innocence, dark pink reflects gratitude, yellow is the rose for friendship, and peach represents appreciation, sincerity, and the timely closing of a deal.

June is the sixth month of the year in the Julian and Gregorian calendars. June is the month with the longest daylight hours of the year in the northern hemisphere and the shortest daylight hours of the year in the southern hemisphere. Some say June is named for the Latin word iuniores, meaning "youths," but the name could also have come from the Greek goddess of marriage, Juno. For this reason, some couples think getting married in June will bring them good luck.


