17th century and soon became popular among the royal courts of England and Spain, which in turn drove popularity among the general public across Europe. These birds are prized for their lovely song as well as their sweet appearance. In addition to the tell-tale yellow and green hues, canaries come in other colors, including white, red, black, orange, and brown. In the past, canaries were used by miners to detect toxic gases in mining tunnels. These endearing birds are celebrated at canary shows held throughout the world. The cartoon character Tweety Bird is a canary. Police informants are said to "sing like a canary," alluding to the bird's tendency to sing (beautiful) elaborate songs, just like informants do when ratting out fellow criminals.
